CHRIS TOTNEY



Chris Totney has been Head of Keyboard Studies at St Mary's School, Calne for just over three years, following nine years' teaching at Dauntsey's School. At Calne, he teaches piano and A Level Music, as well as being involved in the work of numerous choirs, concerts, services and examination sessions. He hails from Stourbridge, West Midlands, where he first studied organ with Andrew Fletcher, before moving on to Durham University with Keith Wright. Whilst there, he released a CD as conductor of University College Chapel Choir under the Lammas label and spent two years as Organ Scholar at the cathedral under the direction of James Lancelot, gaining both the Associateship and Choral Directing diplomas from the Royal College of Organists.

For ten years Chris was Assistant Organist to the Edington Festival of Music within the Liturgy, before standing down in 2013 to help develop the Diocese of Salisbury's PipeUp Scheme for young organists. He now serves on the committees of the Salisbury Diocesan Music in Worship and Choral Festival groups, as well as the Wessex branch of the RSCM. As a pianist, he has been called upon to be a guest performer with the North Wiltshire Symphony Orchestra and has made appearances alongside Andrew Carwood, Bob Chilcott, John Rutter and Gordon Stewart as a workshop accompanist at large-scale regional events.

In 2011, Chris's choral work, The Mystery of Christ, was one of two winning entries at the King James Bible Composition Awards and is published by the RSCM, along with a very accessible set of unison-voice Evening Canticles originally written for Durham Cathedral and Choir School. A brand new set of canticles has been commissioned for this year's choral festivals in the Dioceses of Bath & Wells and Salisbury, and will be performed for the first time at Wells Cathedral in June.

In addition to his school and diocesan work, Chris directs a thriving parish choir at St John the Baptist Church, Devizes, which includes a top line of 21 children representing 11 local schools. Over the past five years, they have made three recordings and sung services in ten different UK cathedrals, with many of the younger choristers also entering for the prestigious Dean's, Bishop's and Gold Awards certified by the RSCM. In 2018, the choir successfully completed its first-ever overseas tour to Latvia following a year in which 15 separate fundraising events were staged.
