Clive Grant studied organ with Alan Wicks at Canterbury Cathedral, and as an undergraduate, was Organ Scholar at the University Church of Great St. Mary's, Cambridge, studying with Peter Hurford and Gerald Gifford. After graduating he continued his postgraduate studies at Cambridge, focusing on organ, harpsichord and piano accompaniment, attending masterclasses in London and Paris. He has given recitals in Cambridge, London, Exeter, Chichester and Llandaff, as well as in venues across Europe, including Belgium, Germany, Czech Republic, Italy and France. For many years he was Head of Music and Expressive Arts at St. Bartholomew's School, Newbury, and is now a lecturer in Music Education at Reading University, looking after the training of Secondary Music PGCE students, as well as contributing to the BAEd programme and supervising MA research students. He is Chairman of the Neil Webster Music Trust, which provides funding for the training of young choral conductors. In 2006 he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.
