JANE VAN TILBORG



Jane van Tilborg was Organ Scholar at Nelson Cathedral (New Zealand) from March 2011 to January 2012 and returned to the UK in 2012 to take up the post of Assistant Organist at St Mary's, Saffron Walden until September 2013, when she returned to New Zealand as Assistant Organist and later Organist at Nelson Cathedral. She returned to the UK in March 2015.

Jane graduated from London University with a PhD in Chemistry and followed a career with Castrol Motor Oils (later part of BP) for 30 years whilst continuing with piano solo and accompaniment studies. Following a 3-year assignment based in USA as a Technology Manager for Castrol South and Central America and Caribbean businesses, Jane retired from Castrol and in September 2009 took up organ studies with Professor Lionel Pike. In Auckland, New Zealand she studied with John Wells in 2011, and again from 2013 to 2015.

Her current organ teacher is Anne Page, based in Cambridge. Jane currently plays for local churches in Suffolk and Norfolk. She plays regularly at St. John the Baptist, Snape, St. Peter & St. Paul, Aldeburgh and occasionally at Wymondham Abbey. She attends organ courses, including one at Moulins Cathedral last August for three days and then for two further weeks with the organist titulaire. In 2016 she attended courses at Moulins Cathedral & Souvigny Abbey in France and at Thomaskirche in Leipzig. When in the USA she played for services in Dobbs Ferry, New York and in Rutland, Vermont. She also performs regularly as piano accompanist to a singer from Saffron Walden and plays the organ for carol services and special events at several local churches in the Aldeburgh and Snape area. She thinks she is very lucky, because these days she spends most of her time learning to play music she really loves on superb instruments.
