JONATHAN HOLL



Jonathan Holl learned the violin, piano and organ from an early age, his principal organ teachers being Dr. Harold Darke and Douglas Hawkrigde (Senior Professor, Royal Academy of Music). He was awarded diplomas from the Royal College of Organists, the Royal College of Music and the Royal Academy of Music.

Whilst pursuing a career as an airline pilot with British Airways, Jonathan held organist appointments at St Anne's Church, Bagshot, Surrey and the Royal Memorial Chapel, RMA Sandhurst. He has played in masterclasses under, amongst others, Dame Gillian Weir and André Isoir, including also a masterclass at 'Bach's Church' - St Thomas, Leipzig, given by the organist Ulrich Böhme. He has studied with Roger Judd at St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle and has played on world famous organs in Academies at Poitiers Cathedral and at the Basilica of the Royal Convent of St. Maximin la Sainte-Baume in Provence.

For twenty years he directed the Verona Singers which raised in excess of £15,000 for charity.

As well as teaching, he is much in demand as a recitalist and accompanist and plays widely in the south of England and elsewhere. He also performs in France and Switzerland, often playing on historic instruments. Recent recital venues have included Southwark Cathedral, Reading Town Hall, Blenheim Palace, as well as St. Leonhard's, Basle.

He has twice been President of the Berkshire Organists' Association.
