

Nathaniel started studying the piano at an early age and began formal tuition on the organ whilst a chorister of St Paul's Cathedral in London.

Nathaniel's musical interests are broad and encompassing but he feels a particular connection to the Baroque era and repertoire of both France and England from the 20th century onwards. His time as a chorister has built a lifelong affinity for choral music, especially that of the Anglican Cathedral tradition. He is interested in organ improvisation and extemporisation, both in a liturgical context and also as a form of music in its own right.

Nathaniel works as a freelance organist playing regularly for services, weddings and concerts. He holds the Associate Diploma from the Royal College of Organists and was the recipient of a Dr John Birch Scholarship award.

He loves to introduce the organ and its music to those who may not be familiar with it, and is always delighted to talk and explain about the instrument to those who are interested. He particularly enjoys finding lesser well known works and composers, and bringing them to new audiences.

Outside of music, Nathaniel has a busy career as a theatrical and television lighting designer. He works regularly in both London and Manchester as well as across the UK, and has worked on productions for all the major broadcasters and production companies.

He holds a BSc and MSc in Mathematics and is always happy to chat about maths and related topics!
