ROSEMARY EVANS



ROSEMARY EVANS first studied the organ with Clifford Harker, Organist and Master of the Choristers at Bristol Cathedral, whilst in her Upper VI year at The Red Maids' School, having studied the piano since a very early age. Her organ lessons continued with Dr. Walter Hillsman and Dr. Harry Gabb at Trinity College of Music, London, as part of her degree course. She gained the Fellowship Diploma in organ playing and was awarded the Cardnell Organ Prize during her time at Trinity. She also gained the Licentiate Diploma in piano playing whilst studying with Jacob Kaletsky. She later continued her organ studies with Dr. Hillsman in Oxford, becoming an Associate of the Royal College of Organists. After leaving Trinity, she gained the Post-Graduate Certificate in Education at Reading University School of Education

She was for many years a full-time music teacher at Downe House School, where she was chapel organist and accompanist to the senior choir, directed by Trevor Selby; annual tours included venues in Europe and the USA. Two compact discs were made during this time. She now teaches piano, organ and music theory privately and piano and theory at St. Mary's School, Calne. She worked at St. Andrew's School, Pangbourne from September 2012 to February 2013 doing maternity cover as chapel organist and piano teacher, under the Director of Music, Gill Blythman, one of our regular recitalists.

Rosemary was the accompanist to Newbury Choral Society from April 1995 to June 2009 and worked under four conductors, Robert Barsby, Janet Lincé, Janet Coxwell and Leo Hussain. She was the Organist and Choir Director at St. Mary's Church, Kintbury from March 2002 to July 2012. In April 2006 she formed Kintbury Special Choir to perform works such as "The Crucifixion" by Stainer, "Requiem" by Fauré, "St. Mark Passion" by Wood, "Gloria" by Vivaldi and "Hear my Prayer" by Mendelssohn. She was also Musical Director of The Cromwell Singers from January 2008 until June 2011 and is occasionally asked back to take a rehearsal as a guest conductor. Since July 2012 she has directed a monthly Choral Evensong choir from the organ at St. Nicolas, which has since moved to St. Mary's, Speen. She has been Organist & Musical Director at St. John's Church, Newbury since January 2014.

When she first moved to Newbury, she was Assistant Organist at St. Nicolas, under the direction of Trevor Selby, former Chairman of NDOA. She is a regular recitalist here, having given the first recital in the current lunchtime series when it started in 1985.

She was elected Chairman of NDOA in March 2010 and she was a member of the IAO Advisory Committee from 2010-2016. This year she has been asked to stand as a trustee on the IAO Council. She was very pleased to be asked to give three recitals recently in Reading, in the Town Hall, November 2015 and in the Minster, June 2016 and May 2017.
